## Schedule occupation therapy 5-7 days post-op

Time Frame	Treatment	Goals
Post-Op Day: 5-7 days	<ul> <li>Evaluate and Treat</li> <li>Remove dressing         <ul> <li>Educate in home care for incision and dressing change</li> <li>If skin graft is present leave stint intact and do not soak to remove dressing</li> </ul> </li> <li>Custom fabricate hand based extension orthosis         <ul> <li>Educate on wear and care instructions</li> <li>Precaution if skin graft is present fabricate non-tension ext orthosis, gradually progress ext each week</li> </ul> </li> <li>Assess AROM</li> <li>Instruct on HEP         <ul> <li>Gentle AROM; tendon glide, joint blocking</li> <li>Progress with AAROM and PROM as tolerated</li> </ul> </li> <li>Follow up is typically 1x/week depending on motion</li> <li>If McCash technique (open incision in palm) educate on wet to dry dressing change</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Edema management</li> <li>HEP</li> <li>ROM</li> <li>Scar management</li> <li>Skin graft protection</li> </ul>
Phase I: 2 weeks post-op	<ul> <li>Readjust orthosis into further extension as tolerated</li> <li>Instruct in scar management techniques if sutures are removed</li> <li>Continue with HEP         <ul> <li>AROM, PROM and AAROM to tolerance</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul> <li>ROM</li> <li>Scar management</li> <li>Edema Management</li> </ul>
Phase II : 3 weeks post-op	<ul> <li>May use modalities as indicated         <ul> <li>Typically not started until 4 weeks post-op</li> <li>May include Ketoprofen, Dexamethasone, or Potassium lodide as indicated.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Readjust orthosis PRN</li> <li>Continue with HEP</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Scar management</li> <li>ROM</li> </ul>

Phase III:	<ul> <li>Discontinue night time orthosis when determined by physician</li> </ul>
3-6 months post-	
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
